An update on the former residents at the Riverside Hotel

Thank you to people who have prayed for those at the hotel whilst the hotel closed and 90 people were relocated. People stayed calm during the three days that they moved. Everyone was provided with a suitcase: local people responded to this request fantastically. It gave people dignity when leaving with their possessions. It was very special.

Families have been moved to a Leamington hotel. Most women have been moved to a Coventry hotel. Most men have been moved to a Tamworth hotel.

A few women who came to Drop In hope to be able to come occasionally, so we should see them around from time to time.

Of those who were more closely connected with our church community, coming to services on Sundays and the bible study groups on Fridays:

One lady had already connected with an Eritrean church which meets at the Elim Pentecostal Church which is her church background and she will be local to them in Coventry.

Two men are in Allesley where I understand there is a good church. They hope to rejoin us at St John's services when possible.

Two women are in Nottingham. They are 300m from St Nic's Church in Nottingham, where I attended and where Ken and I married. They went to the service on Sunday and plan to go to the English lessons run by the church in the week.

Sadly, one man chose not to move to a hotel. This person has moved to London. We are in contact with him.

One young lady, part of the group closely connected with the church, wrote to thank people. She asked that her message passed to local charities and groups which had supported them:


