Flourish – April 2025 report



Easter is a time for hope and new life. and we have so much to be thankful for. Please join us in praising God for His faithfulness!

"Flourish has helped me be more positive and never doubt myself"
This term, we've had the privilege of supporting 92 girls through 13 group courses and 43 girls through one-to-one mentoring. While many of these journeys are still ongoing, we are already witnessing lives being transformed. One girl shared: "The best thing has been taking a break to think about how I'm actually feeling." Another mentee's grandmother reflected: "In a subtle way, it has made her more confident and more determined." This echoes the Easter message of hope—that in Christ, we are made new, called into confidence and peace.

- In January, four girls from our Flourish Advisory Board took part in a **dance-circus workshop with Motionhouse**. This creative experience encouraged them to step out of their comfort zones and try something new. One girl said: "*It was so fun to do something completely new and out Of my comfort zone—I loved it!*"
- We also thank God for Nic, our new Head Of Services, who has stepped into her role with passion and dedication, leading our Services Team to grow and flourish.
- Following a fantastic information evening, we've recruited 11 new mentors who are soon to begin training. We thank God for each of them and the impact they will have on the lives of local girls.

Please join us in prayer for:

- The girls we support, especially those struggling to attend school. Please pray that our mentors would help them see their worth and value, so they can say, like one mentee recently shared, "I have learnt that my value never changes."
- Our 1 1 new volunteer mentors—that they would thrive as part of the Flourish team, and be equipped with wisdom, compassion, and courage as they journey alongside the girls.
- Our ongoing fundraising efforts—so that we can continue to walk alongside girls in our community, now and into the future.

"The best thing about mentoring was being able to look back on things I was struggling with knowing that I have improved."
