Prayer and discernment on the potential for mission to the new housing development (Thickthorn) using the church site

Overview

A significant number of new houses will be built in Kenilworth in the next 5 years. This includes c. 1,400 in the 'Thickthorn' (Kenilworth Gate) development site. It is currently the intention that c. 40% of these houses will be 'Affordable Housing' or designated for 'First-Time Buyers'. Thus, it is likely that there will be a significant number of young(er) families on this estate.

There is clearly a significant challenge/opportunity for us as a church: a new harvest field will be appearing on our doorstep...

We have communicated with elected representatives (Town/District Council) and had a meeting with staff from the Planning Department (District Council) to discuss what role St John's Church might play in a couple of aspects:

- enabling the new (Thickthorn) estate to become integrated into the rest of the town;
- providing community facilities to meet the needs of the population.

It is unclear at the moment what community facilities (if any) will be available on the new estate. It is likely in any case that such facilities will be the last phase of the building to be carried out (i.e. 2029). We have agreed to keep in touch with the Planning Department, who are interested in working with us, though the situation at the moment is vague. The nearest public building(s) to the new estate will be the current St John's Church buildings (cavern, Large Hall, Small Hall). These buildings are starting to cost us money in maintenance, badly need refurbishment and are not energy efficient. In short: they are not fit for purpose. A building project would probably involve demolishing these premises and building a suite of units that are multi-purpose, energy efficient and easy to maintain.

A topic for prayer and discernment

What might we do to advance the kingdom of God in this situation? Providing much needed community facilities would attract a lot of people into the 'church orbit'. Is now the right time to embark upon a major building project? Or would it be a distraction? If a major building project isn't the solution, then what should we do to meet this challenge and realise this opportunity to advance God's kingdom?

Where is God in this? Is this a 'nations will come to your light' moment or are we called to go out and travel light?

We need to spend some weeks praying about this and seeking discernment from the LORD.

FareShare

Do you know anyone who may benefit from extra food? It may be that one of your friends or neighbours could do with a little help. FareShare food is made available at church several times a week for those in need. If anyone would like to give you their names for food we will happily contact them every time food becomes available.
